- *Connecting* Connect with Jesus, one another, and the world
- Growing spiritually Deepen your faith, strengthen your commitment, and rediscover your purpose
- Telling your story Discover how God's story and your story come together to shape your future
- Discovering gifts and assets Assess and utilize your God-given gifts in loving service to Christ and neighbor
- Leading through change Change is hard, but essential for the church to grow. Learn how to lead through healthy change
- Action planning Learn basic principles for congregational renewal and develop a contextual mission/action plan
- Participating in a journey Utilize the provided tools and resources and join the Holy Spirit on a journey of discernment, growth and new life



Therefore, if anyone is in Christ, the new creation has come: The old has gone, the new is here!

Desired Outcomes:

- At its very heart, the E-Connect process is centered in the belief that God has provided everything a congregation needs to carry out the ministry God calls it to do
- Teams learn the basic principles of congregational health and renewal and develop a mission/action plan for moving forward toward God's promised future
- Through the work of the Holy Spirit, congregational members will become energized about the Good News of Jesus Christ and passionate about sharing and living the Gospel

What E-Connect (Ecumenical-Connect) is:

- A congregational transformational ministry process which involves both spiritual and structural transformation
- An outgrowth of the Connect process developed by the Indiana-Kentucky Synod, Evangelical Lutheran Church in America (ELCA)
- An ecumenical ministry in Indiana and Kentucky, comprising the ELCA, The Episcopal Church, the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.), and the United Church of Christ
- A process made possible by a Lilly Endowment Thriving Congregations Grant

What It's About:

- Connecting with Jesus, one another, and the world by lining up the congregation's purpose, identity, and mission with God's vision and plan
- Renewing your congregation by linking the gifts that God has given you with God's vision for the world
- Celebrating and using what you have, rather than lamenting about and focusing on what you don't have
- Finding energy, purpose, and direction through God's work — prayer, conversation, and faith practices
- Navigating change calmly, confidently, and effectively



Who Shares the Journey:

- Congregations who ground themselves in Bible study, prayer, discussion, and action-reflection as they engage in a two-year transformational ministry process to live out the Gospel of God's vision for the world
- Mentors who walk with each congregation during the process, actively listening and asking appropriate questions to keep the process on track
- A congregational E-Connect team who is named and blessed, consisting of the pastoral leader and four to seven (4-7) congregational leaders whose commitments and caring for the congregation are well demonstrated

How It Works:

 Getting Started — The congregation's elected leaders and pastoral leader decide to participate, assemble a team, designate a team leader who is not the pastoral leader, gain congregational support, and sign the Transformational Ministry Covenant provided to them in preparation for the four training events (called "Links")

- *Training Events* The congregation will engage with a cohort of congregations in four (4) Links (training events), about six months apart. A detailed schedule will be provided to registered teams
- Looking Back, Looking Forward In this session, scheduled six months after Link 4 training, the congregation, with the mentor and others, looks back at their journey and makes plans for continuing their momentum, energy, and transformation into the future
- Cost \$75 per congregational team for each of the 4 Links. All materials, accommodations, meals, and mileage are covered by the Lilly Endowment Thriving Congregations Grant
